Pastor Piphó's Persective "Celebrating the Resurrection"

"For Christians, the resurrection of Jesus Christ is not about the resuscitation of the body of our dead leader, rather the resurrection of Jesus is the creation of an entirely new heaven and earth."

+ Sundays and Seasons

There's a difference between resuscitation and resurrection.

A resuscitation is experienced by one who has been revived through CPR or other medical efforts after their hearts have stopped. After their near-death experience people return to the life they lived prior to their harrowing ordeal, though perhaps with a new outlook on life.

A resurrection is experienced by those who have encountered the risen Christ and who participate in God's new creation work. The resurrection of Jesus was not a resuscitation. Though raised from the dead, Jesus did not return to his earthly ministry as Jesus of Nazareth. Instead, in the resurrection God created apostles out of disciples and the ministry of Christ passed from the single person of Jesus of Nazareth into the communion of saints known as Christ's Church on earth.

The resurrection of Jesus is not a one-body, one-time, one-day event that happened 2,000 years ago. The resurrection of Jesus is the ongoing power of God bringing new life into the world. Whereas a resuscitation is a revival of once what was, the resurrection is the creation of what will be, the forward movement of God producing a new creation.

The disciples experienced the resurrection and moved out from behind locked doors. In resurrection power the apostles fearlessly proclaimed the resurrection of Christ to all who would listen. The zealot Saul who had persecuted the church experienced the resurrection and became the Apostle Paul whose missionary activities built the early church. Peter who had denied knowing Christ experienced the resurrection and raised

Tabitha from the dead and changed his mind to include Gentile believers in the mission of Christ. Sinners experienced the resurrection and were transformed, changed, and forward as new creations.

Nearly 75-years ago, the congregations of First Lutheran, Calvary Lutheran, and Bethany Lutheran experienced the resurrection in their decision to close their congregations and form Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church. In the resurrection, faithful members left behind all that was good and right and holy and life changing and powerful in their predecessor congregations to participate in the new creation forward movement of God birthing a new congregation.

What resurrection, new creation, forward movement work is Christ working in your life? How is the resurrection power of God calling us into a new creation as Trinity Church for today and tomorrow? In what ways is the risen Christ calling us forward to meet him as he goes ahead of us into God's new creation?

Perhaps we would prefer a resuscitation, a revival of what once was, a return to what is more comfortable and familiar? But that is not the resurrection we celebrate this Easter season. We celebrate that Christ is raised from the dead leading us into a new creation. In the words of the prophet, "For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope." (Jeremiah 29:11). Alive in resurrection hope, may we move into our future, confident that the resurrected Christ lives there in a new heaven and a new earth of peace, friendship, hope, healing, and salvation. Alleluia! Christ is risen!

COUNCIL UPDATE – PRESIDENT KAREN COUTURIER

During our April Council meeting we focused on the interpretation of the Congregational Assessment Tool (CAT) results and plans for sharing the findings with the congregation. A summary of a CAT subcommittee report appears in this newsletter and on our website.

Council will host Coffee hours in May in Jeppson Hall from 11:15-12:15

We will have short (15 minute) presentations focused on key areas of the CAT followed by opportunity for conversation and coffee.

- 5/1- Priorities- Top 3 areas where we would like to expand or improve our ministries. Comparison to 2016 CAT
- 5/8- Eight Performance indices (hospitality, morale, conflict management, governance, education, spiritual vitality, worship and music, readiness for ministry) Comparison to 2016 CAT
- 5/15 - Drivers of Energy, Satisfaction, Critical Success factors and sense of our Purpose.
- 5/22 - Responses to Question 'Now that's What it means to be the church!'

Information to be covered at each session will be in the bulletin or news blast the week prior. We hope these opportunities to share the highlights of the CAT report will help us better understand our congregations' ideas about how best to discover our sense of purpose as a community of faith. For anyone interested in the entire CAT report and recording of Pastor Sara Anderson's interpretation of Trinity's CAT please let Pastor Nathan, myself or a Council member know and we can email you the report and the recording link. The report is 30 pages and recording approximately 2 hours.

NEIGHBORHOOD SUPPORT TEAM UPDATE

This is the month of Ramadan, which has shaped life for the Afghan family. All but the seven-year-old daughter have been refraining from food and drink from sunup until sundown, and the family has been involved in fewer activities outside the home, with more time devoted to prayer. While they are observing the disciplines strictly, they look forward to May 2, Eid ul-Fitr, the celebration of the end of the month of fasting.

Our committees continue their work with the family. The healthcare committee has taken family members for their initial intake appointments at the Family Health Center, and the family now has a primary care provider at the Refugee Clinic. Eye appointments and dental appointments are being arranged as needed.

The education committee continues to help with getting the adults to their English classes on Monday, Wednesday and Friday at the Fanning Building on Chatham St. Opening a bank account, writing checks, paying utility bills, and using stamps to mail the envelopes, have been new learnings this month. Each family member is speaking English a little more, and the children are beginning to recognize sight words in beginning reader books. We would welcome donations of children's books in good condition.

Our employment committee is actively looking for job opportunities for the father and the 19 yr. old son, who would like to work after school and on Saturdays. If you know of any possibilities for employment, please contact Bev Dumas bevdumas@gmail.com.

Our transportation committee still has been providing trips to the grocery store and to India Market in Shrewsbury, a favorite place to shop. (They carry the best Afghan bread!) Two members of the committee cannot drive right now, for health reasons, and we would appreciate more volunteers to drive the family as needed. If you have been contributing electronically via the Trinity web page, we encourage you to continue to use this method—it's a great time and labor saver for volunteers and office staff! If you give electronically via your smartphone or tablet, please note that the Give+ app will be replaced at the end of April with the new Vanco Mobile Faith Engagement app, found on the Apple App Store and Google Play Store. Just download the app now to your mobile device—you can sign in with your existing Give+ username and password. Once you've installed the app and signed into your account, find Trinity by entering "Worcester" in the Search box and tapping the "Find My Organization" button. Tap on Trinity's name and logo in the search results and you'll be connected! The new app allows you the same options for giving and scheduling gifts currently available.

Don't have a Give+ account but want to try the new app? Download the Vanco Mobile Faith Engagement app to your mobile device and set up an account with an email address and password. It's that easy and takes about three minutes!

The First Family Sunday school had 8 families in April (Yahoo!) and Jena is looking forward eagerly to Holy Week: she is helping to plan family experiences at 3:45 for Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday. Preschool Chapel and regular staff meetings keep her Tuesdays full and her Lenten Video and "Now is the Time" Google Classroom offerings continue. She reports enthusiasm and appreciation from the students at WPI for the baked goodies, hearing: "YES! Church lady food!" and "That church is so nice to us!" Jena says we will continue this regular support for the remainder of the school year and rework as a once a month activity next year.

Jena connected this month with Tau Kappa Epsilon (across the street) to help do some heavy lifting at TLC. She continues to maintain connection with the Clemente director (to coordinate their childcare in our space), with Synod youth leaders, with the Care Team (to keep card ministry going), and with the Faith in Action and Welcome chairs. She reports that Trinity hosted a small group of high school students from VT. for one night so they could attend a local college event and that TLC has been asked to provide childcare for the upcoming Synod Assembly. She wants congregants to consider whether they can help with that event. Our building too is busy, busy!

Jena also met on March 26 with former EPMDC staff to discuss summer plans: the possibility of sending children to Calumet as well as restarting EPMDC next summer with just one week of day camp in Worcester. She will be updating Scholarship/Campership info...due back to Trinity by the end of May. She is contemplating a welcome WPI students "back to school" event at the end of the summer with hot dogs in the parking lot on move-in day! (Sounds fun to this church mouse!)

Cantor Mark

Preparation for Holy Week always makes for an intensely busy time for Cantor Mark in the music/worship department! This year's week began with a Palm Sunday "Music at Trinity" performance of an exciting new, contemporary *St Luke's Passion*, created by William David Cooper, who was on hand to play organ for the performance along with a fabulous chamber orchestra, the ethereal soprano who sang the part of Jesus in its recent New York Premiere, and a group of talented local professional singers.

All combined, a moving, thoughtful, and exciting musical experience to commence Holy Week. (Church mouse says, if you missed it, find it online at www.vimeo.com/trinityworcester. So worth the experience!)

Lots of rehearsals this month, (Mark reports 60 hours of rehearsal time!) with Trinity Choir and this special performance group, the usual TLC Preschool music classes (4) , and 2 Junior Chorister/ WeeSing rehearsals (mouse thinks it's wonderful to have little ones to sing again!) Cantor Mark reports 176 hours dealing with worship materials, and 46 hours planning time. A funeral, the usual weekly staff meetings, Sunday and Wednesday services, IHN Board meetings, and Tuesday morning Bible Studies have kept Mark very busy!

This is just such a busy time for TLC's entire staff and Pastor is absolutely no exception! 7 sermons, 13 Eucharists, numerous Bible Studies, Adult Forums, Preschool Chapels, "Grace Unbounded" video reflections, and not to forget, preparation for the upcoming events of Holy Week have filled his days! He reports a number of Home/Hospital Visits this past month as well (church mouse counted 12!) and a funeral, in addition to weekly staff and Council/committee meetings. Pastor Nathan participated in 2 planning meetings for the Thursday night Eucharist of Synod Assembly, which will be hosted by Trinity on June 9 before the Full Synod Assembly convenes at the DCU Center June 9 - 11. He also attended 4 meetings to continue Worcester Interfaith efforts, as well as several Zooms and conversations to further his Antiracism work.

Pastor Nathan found time this month to attend the Senior Luncheon, the Trinity Book Club, the Clergy Support Group, and had a Zoom with Pr. Anderson concerning the CAT Interpretation. More news on that to come! He also was the first to host "Dinner with a Chaplain" on March 20 at the WPI Cafeteria, facilitating conversation among those who attended. (He will be followed next week by the Imams from the Worcester Islamic Center.)
