# Pastor Pipho's Perspective


"Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

On Wednesday, February 14, the Church begins the season of Lent. With the solemn liturgies of Ash Wednesday we begin our annual pilgrimage to the joyful baptismal waters of Easter. I invite you to take seriously the disciplines of Lent and to be open to the Holy Spirit working new faith and life.

- 1. <u>Communal Worship</u> attend worship every Sunday in Lent and begin Lent with ashes on your foreheads and the truth ringing in your ears: we are dust, we are mortal, we are finite, we need God's help. We do not begin this journey trusting in our own strength to overcome and persevere, but trusting in the grace of God to lead and sustain us. Every Sunday, come together with other believers to be fed with Christ's presence in word, sacrament, and other disciples.
- 2. <u>Time & Talent Commitment Pledge Drive</u> submit your "Time & Talent Commitment Form" on Sunday, February 18th. The Stewardship Committee has prepared "Time & Talent Commitment Forms" to invite you to grow in the offering of your time and talent to the congregation. In what ways is Christ inviting you to faith renewal through a renewed commitment to participate in the life of Trinity? As you have been hearing me say in sermons, "The Church of Jesus Christ does not have a mission. The Church <u>IS</u> the mission of Jesus Christ." In what ways are you willing to commit to

participating in that mission?

3. <u>Daily Lenten Devotionals</u> – read/pray/reflect each day guided by the "Gathered Into One: Devotions for Lent 2024." This daily devotional is made available for free to all members and friends of Trinity (including Large Print versions) as a resource for daily devotions.



- 4. <u>Daily Video Blogs</u> watch the brief daily videos produced by the ministry staff and lay members posted on the Trinity website (<u>www.trinityworc.org</u>) each day in Lent (except Sundays when we gather together in worship). These brief daily videos supplement the daily mediation from the Lenten devotional. If you would like to challenge yourself by filming a reflection please let me or Cantor Mark know and we would be happy to include you on the schedule.
- 5. <u>Fasting</u> commit to a discipline of fasting. I invite you to think more deeply about fasting than just about fasting from earthly delights like chocolate or ice cream. I have fasted from the sounds of television, radio, and social media during certain parts of the day (e.g. after 8:00 p.m. until bedtime so my day ends in silence) and from speeding (and watched all of Massachusetts fly by me on the turnpike as I gently cruised at 65 mph in the far right lane of the pike). The point is: what can disrupt your routine in order to mark the season of Lent as an intentional time of prayer, confession, reflection, and repentance?
- 6. <u>Prayer</u> commit to a discipline of prayer. This could easily be accomplished by committing to praying through the "Gathered Into One" daily devotional. You might also commit to praying the Lord's Prayer daily when you wake up and go to bed and/or to commit to praying daily for the people in the printed prayer list in the bulletin. The point is: in what way can you renew your commitment to communicating with God through prayer in the season of Lent?
- 7. Almsgiving commit to a discipline of almsgiving, responding to people in need. How can you give yourself, and your money, to grow in your relationship with your neighbors? You might consider an act of almsgiving showing up on Saturdays at Trinity in February and March to help serve breakfast at the Saturday basketball program. You might consider an almsgiving discipline reaching out to a grieving or hurting friend, neighbor, or family member. The point is: in what way can you grow in your relationship with God by growing in relationships of love and service with those hurting in your lives?

Whew, that's quite a list, but know that these invitations are not a "To-Do List." They are invitation of the Church of Jesus Christ to grow in faith and in relationship with God's people. In these invitations, how do you discern the Holy Spirit calling you to grow deeper in your faith in God and in your commitment and relationships with God's people? In what ways does your personal reflection lead you into public relationship and service with God's people?

#### COUNCIL PRESIDENT'S REPORT – KAREN COUTURIER

Sharing some highlights of the January 8, 2024 Council meeting.

We focused on wrapping up old business from 2023, preparing for the Annual Meeting and looking ahead to new projects of committees and ministry teams for 2024. In his monthly report, Pastor Nathan highlighted work of the Stewardship committee on a Time and Talent Commitment Card to be introduced during Lent.

The Technology committee has been working on redesigning our website with a prototype to be available in January or February for review. Treasurer Nancy Fontneau noted we will update the proposed 2024 budget to show \$25,000 for a future staff position in the Wages and Salary line.

Council voted unanimously to authorize spending up to \$1,650 as an unbudgeted expense to pay for accounting assistance from Spinelli in setting up QuickBooks online.

The Nominating committee presented a slate of candidates. We currently have 6 candidates for 6 open Council positions, 4 candidates for the Nominating committee and 2 candidates for the N.E Synod Assembly and Bishop's Election. Additional nominations are welcome and will be taken from the floor at the Annual meeting. Council approved a Finance Committee proposal that the unbudgeted income from the clothing shed be allocated to the Faith in Action Fund.

# **Building** use update

- T.E.C. school The negotiating team has reviewed details of the standardized lease with our legal consultant. We're scheduled to meet with T.E.C School director, Rupali Sharma in January and will request her response within 30 days.
- The Clemente contract was signed in December.
- We received an invoice for legal services related to Building use contracts.
   Council voted to authorize the bill from Fletcher Tilton for contract work be paid out of the 2023 unbudgeted expense line 7000.
- Council voted to add a line to the 2024 Budget for Building Use Legal Fees in the amount of \$1,000.

# **Listening Team for Staffing Plan**

The Listening Team comprised of members of the Council and Personnel committee will present a plan at the Annual meeting to have conversations with the congregation about current and future staffing needs with special focus on youth, family and outreach ministry.

#### Sabbatical Artwork Team

An Artwork team has formed to review artwork displayed in the Trinity building and grounds, to lead conversation with the congregation about the importance of artwork that is fully inclusive of the body of Christ, and intentionally proclaims welcome to persons of color and all God's children. The Team presented their initial plan at the Annual meeting.

#### **New Business**

Council Discussion on Trinity's recycling efforts. Council voted to instruct Building Manager, Frank Ricardo, to present to the Council at the March Council meeting economical alternatives for waste disposal companies that recycle items designated as recyclable. Our current waste disposal company incinerates all trash and does not separate recyclables.

Our newly elected Council begins February with a full day retreat Saturday February 10, 2024. We will get to know each other, organize ourselves for the year ahead and elect new officers.

As I complete my term as your Council President, I am thankful for all the Council members for faith and perseverance in our work together. It has been a privilege and pleasure to be a part of this dedicated leadership team.

### ANNUAL MEETING UPDATE

The Congregational Annual Meeting was held following the 10:00 a.m. Holy Eucharist on Sunday, January 28, 2024. The meeting was called to order by Council President Karen Couturier and a quorum was established. The Congregation:

- 1. approved the 2024 Congregational Budget as presented. Three amendments to the budget failed.
- 2. approved Bylaws defining the responsibilities of the Financial Secretary and establishing the TLC Care Team as a Ministry Team.
- 3. elected Nathan Cummings, Kevin Erkkila, Jim Drackley, and Dale Mattice to three-year terms on the Congregational Council.
- 4. elected Rick Lagueux and Brad Lehman to one-year terms on the Congregational Council.
- 5. elected Loie Angelsten, Amanda Cummings, Dave Horn, and Paula Wyble to the 2024 Nominating Committee.
- 6. elected Susan Brown and Nathan Cummings as Voting Members to the 2024 New England Synod Assembly.
- 7. heard reports from the Stewardship Team (Kevin Erkkila), Listening Team (Karen Couturier), and Artwork Team (Deacon Susan Lindberg Haley).
- 8. Thanked Karen Couturier with a standing ovation in recognition for her two terms as Council President.

RETIREES: GIVE TO TRINITY, GAIN TAX BENEFITS / If charitable giving is part of your financial plan in retirement, a QCD to Trinity from your IRA may provide tax benefits for you. A QCD (qualified charitable distribution) is a gift made by direct transfer from an IRA to a qualified charitable organization, such as Trinity. Unlike charitable gifts made from cash received by the IRA owner from their account, a QCD generates neither a tax deduction nor a bump in taxable income. However, like a distribution to the IRA owner, a QCD can help fulfill an annual required minimum distribution (RMD). QCDs can only be made from IRAs, from which a QCD may then be made. IRA owners who are at least 70-1/2 years of age can make QCDs of up to \$100,000 annually.

Donors should consult their tax, financial and legal advisors for guidance on including QCDs in their retirement financial plan and then contact Trinity at 508-753-2989 or by e-mail <a href="mailto:treasurer@trinityworc.org">treasurer@trinityworc.org</a>, <a href="mailto:npipho@trinityworc.org">npipho@trinityworc.org</a> to discuss giving intentions. UPDATE RECURRING ELECTRONIC PLEDGE PAYMENTS NOW / Many members have availed themselves of the convenience of managing their pledge to Trinity through electronic payments at regular intervals through their VANCO account. Those who do so are reminded that any changes in the amount of their pledge for 2024 require deleting the 2023 recurring gift and starting a new one for the current year. To do this, sign into your VANCO account, click on Profile, select Transactions from the menu on the Profile page, and delete the recurring pledge transaction. Then return to the Home page and create your new recurring pledge gift. Deleting the old transaction will not delete the associated giving history, which will still be available for you to use in reconciling bank accounts and quarterly statements. The good news is that you now can set both a starting and an ending date for recurring transactions when you set them up, eliminating the need to delete the old transaction when updating a recurring gift.

If you checked the box on your Commitment Card authorizing the Financial Secretary to update your electronic transaction for you, know that this is not possible. For your security, the Financial Secretary cannot access your password-protected VANCO account. We regret any inconvenience this may have caused.

SUNDAY ADULT FORUM / "Three Day Feast: An Adult Forum for Lent 2024" will be held on Sundays, February 25, March 3, 10, 24, and April 7, 14 at 11:30 a.m. in the Library (no sessions on March 17 or Easter Sunday). Each year, Christians around the world commemorate the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. We do this over a three day feast, beginning at sundown on the Thursday before Easter. This Three Day Feast is sometimes called the Triduum, Latin for "the three days." In the observance of these three days, we mean to enact the meaning of the crucified and resurrected Christ.

At Trinity Church this Lent (and a few times in Easter), we will study the liturgy of the Great Three Days. This forum for adults is an excellent 6 session study for both those new to Christian faith and practice, and those who have been lifelong participants in Christian worship. Each session will also be available online via Zoom. The textbook, "The Three-Day Feast" by Gail Ramshaw will be available for purchase at the class sessions. In Sunday's gospel reading, Jesus shows his power by healing Peter's mother-in-law, but he also chooses to have his power hidden from others. This year listening to Mark's gospel, we often will hear about Jesus as hidden in his weakness and crucifixion, but made known as the risen Christ to believers both then and now. The first reading is one of several in the Old Testament that likens the faithful to soaring eagles.

Over the Sundays after Epiphany, we have seen Jesus show himself to be Christ, the one anointed by God to be our Savior. This Sunday, the Transfiguration, concludes the time after Epiphany, as Jesus appears on a mountain in divine glory. Keep in mind that in three days, on Ash Wednesday, we begin the climb to the mountain of Jesus' crucifixion. The church holds side by side the glory of God and the cross of Jesus.
