Keeping the Feast

Each year, Christians observe the feast of Passover by celebrating the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. We keep this feast by telling the story and enacting the meaning of the story. We do all this in the community of the church, and not by ourselves. We need one another to keep this feast.

We have been studying this feast in our Sunday Adult Forum, *The Three Day Feast.* The Three Days, which stand at the center of the Christian year, begin at sundown on Maundy Thursday and conclude at sundown on Easter Day. The liturgy of the Three Days begins on Maundy Thursday evening with the service of Holy Eucharist, footwashing, and the stripping of the altar. The Three Days service continues on Good Friday with the reading of the Passion according to St. John, the bidding prayer and reproaches, and the adoration of the crucified. The Three Days come to a climax in the great Vigil of Easter on Holy Saturday with a new fire, the blessing and lighting of the paschal (Passover) candle, the Easter Proclamation, the service of readings, baptism and baptismal renewal, and the first Eucharist of Easter. The Three Days close on Easter Day. The liturgy of the Three Days is *one* liturgy spread out over three days. Each day relies on the other for us to tell the story well.

We invite you to make the Three Days and the rites for the days a priority in your life. To understand the Christian life, one must be inserted in the story of the life, death, and resurrection of Christ. While every Sunday is a celebration of the resurrection, the annual observance of the Three Days celebrates the resurrection in a fullness that is not possible on Sundays. During the Three Days, by telling the story from the gospel of John, we hear one way to speak of our faith. On Sundays this year, we tell the story from the gospel of Mark, a very different story compared to the gospel of John. The two stories, set side by side, show us many views of Christ.

As some of you know, I am the son of a Lutheran pastor. I spent every Sunday of my childhood and youth in worship. It was not until I went to my first Easter Vigil in 1984 at University Lutheran Church in Philadelphia that my eyes were open to the depths of the Christian life. The Three Days changed my life of faith forever. I have confidence that if you join me in keep the feast this year at Trinity Church, your life of faith will be changed, and you will see with new eyes Christ for the life of the world.

COUNCIL PRESIDENT'S REPORT – ROZ HORN

Here are some highlights from the Congregational Council Meeting of Feb. 12, 2024.

The first order of business was the Election of Officers. The following were elected:

- President: Roz Horn
- Vice President: Nathan Cummings
- Secretary: Beth Getman

The offices of Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer are already held by Nancy Fontneau and Dick Liberty, and Lisa Stone continues as Financial Secretary.

In his monthly report, Pastor Nathan described the Service schedule for Lent and Holy Week. He encouraged Council members to take part in the daily video devotions reflecting on the "Gathered Into One" Lenten devotional booklet. He reported on his vacation schedule in March (3/7 - 3/21), including guest preachers. He also announced that Pastor Nelson Rabell-Gonzales, who had been scheduled to preach during Pastor Nathan's sabbatical, has been rescheduled to come on May 26, 2024.

The Treasurer reported a positive balance but a detailed report is delayed while the Quickbooks accounts are being transferred to the new system. A training session for the new version of Quickbooks has been held. A motion by the Finance Committee encouraging Committee Chairs, Ministry Team Chairs and Staff to stay within their budget allocations was amended and passed.

The Property Committee reported that donations to the clothes shed produced an income of \$465.00 from the St. Pauly Foundation as of the end of the year. All clothing is donated to the St. Pauly Foundation who distributes it world-wide to needy areas. The income received by Trinity goes to the Faith in Action fund.


The remaining business for the Council consisted of determining the 2024-2025 meeting schedule for the Council and the Executive Committee, and assigning Council and Staff Liaisons to the Governance Committees and Ministry Teams. The Chairs of all these groups will receive a list of these Liaisons, whose purpose is to facilitate communication among Trinity's many ministries and its leadership.

This report by the President of the Church Council is an informal summary of the business conducted by the Council each month. It is offered in order to facilitate open communication between Trinity's church leadership and the general membership. A detailed report of each Council meeting is recorded by the Council Secretary and reported to the Council at the next monthly meeting. Once those Minutes have been approved by the Council, they are available to anyone who requests a copy.

As I begin my term as your Council President, I am humbled and honored to have been chosen to serve in this capacity, and I shall continually ask God to help and guide me.

Unlike in previous years, this year there will be only one liturgy on Maundy Thursday, March 28 at 7:00 p.m. (with Holy Eucharist, foot washing, the Trinity Choir, and stripping of the altar) and one liturgy on Good Friday, March 29 at Noon (with the Trinity Choir). There are no changes to the Easter Vigil (Saturday, March 30 at 7:00 p.m.) and Easter Sunday liturgies (Sunday, March 31 at 10:00 a.m.). Please speak with Pastor Nathan if you would like a ride to the Maundy Thursday or Easter Vigil evening liturgies.

A CROSS FOR LENT AND BEYOND – ARTWORK TEAM UPDATE / Throughout Lent, you will see the Ethiopian processional cross displayed next to the lectern and used during the gospel reading. The Artwork Team has made a conscious choice to adorn the cross with a piece of traditional Kente cloth. Kente cloth has been used in modern times as a symbol of African identity. Our hope is that it serves as a visual reminder of our connection to our siblings worshiping alongside us in 23 countries across Africa. This is not the first time Trinity has used the Ethiopian cross. Most recently, Cantor Mark used it during the virtual evening prayer sessions we held in 2020-21.

Historically, Ethiopian monarchs often gifted processional crosses as signs of gratitude, which leads us to wonder ... how did Trinity come to be in possession of one? We believe it was gifted to the congregation some time during Pastor Susan's tenure, but we have yet to confirm this information. If you have any insight of the cross's origin, we'd love to connect with you. As a reminder, the Artwork Committee was formed following congregational discussions from our "We Have a Dream" speaker series that occurred during Pastor Nathan's sabbatical in 2023. Our purpose is to look thoroughly at the visual and auditory art we have at Trinity and find ways to honor, celebrate and welcome persons of color through these mediums.

SUNDAY ADULT FORUM / "Three Day Feast: An Adult Forum for Lent 2024" will be held on Sundays, March 3, 10, 24, and April 7, 14 at 11:30 a.m. in the Library (no sessions on March 17 or Easter Sunday). Each year, Christians around the world commemorate the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. We do this over a three day feast, beginning at sundown on the Thursday before Easter. This Three Day Feast is sometimes called the Triduum, Latin for "the three days." In the observance of these three days, we mean to enact the meaning of the crucified and resurrected Christ. At Trinity Church this Lent (and a few times in Easter), we will study the liturgy of the Great Three Days. This forum for adults is an excellent 6 session study for both those new to Christian faith and practice, and those who have been lifelong participants in Christian worship. Each session will also be available online via Zoom. The textbook, "The Three-Day Feast" by Gail Ramshaw will be available for purchase at the class sessions. This Thursday is called "Maundy," which means "command," from the verse in John's gospel in which Jesus commands us to love another as he loved us. We hear about the Passover lamb, Jesus' last meal with his disciples before his death, and Jesus washing his disciples' feet. You are invited to have your feet washed and then to wash the feet of another worshiper. You hold the heel, you pour the water, you wipe it dry.
